THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

At the time of Moses, in about 1250 BC, God made a covenant with the Israelites when he promised them his love and support with the words: 'You will be my people and I will be your God' – a relationship which required the observance of the law and the ritual offering of animal sacrifices, which together demonstrated the commitment of the people to their love of God.

Up to the time of the birth of Jesus 2018 years ago, this covenant was still in place. But over the next 30 years, particularly during the three years of Jesus' ministry, a whole new relationship between God and man evolved. This was still based upon an on-going love of God, but now introducing a profound love of neighbour as well. To encourage this 'Christian' way of life, Jesus left a special legacy, which he imparted to the apostles at The Last Supper. He took bread, and giving thanks he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying 'take this all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body'. He then took the chalice and gave it to his disciples saying 'take this all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood'.

It is good to be reminded that at his ordination a priest's hands are anointed with the Oil of Chrism, giving him the wonderful faculty of converting the substance of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, (only the appearance of bread and wine still remaining).

We give thanks to our devoted priests as they carry out this sacred duty every day of the year at each Mass they celebrate. We are strengthened by receiving Christ's Body and Blood in Holy Communion and are enabled through this gift to spread the Good News of God's Kingdom to all people, through all that we say and do.
