# TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B)

#### Dear Friends.

"With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption" we say in response to Psalm 129 today. Our reading from Genesis 3 shows the seductiveness of the evil one and how can draw people into temptation and then into sin. In the past most people would have a sense of personal disappointment, guilt or shame about their sins and they would see a need to confess their sin and have forgiveness. Today the sense of sin has diminished in our society and we have an exaggerated emphasis on personal freedom and choice, regardless or God's law or the rights of others. The recent referendum in Ireland to abolish or retain the 8th Amendment to the Constitution, that guaranteed the equal dignity and right to life of the mother and child in the womb, was largely fought on "a woman's right to choose". The result and the way it was shamefully celebrated shows that a moral compass on what is right has been lost and replaced by a centring on self and personal choice.

In Genesis, no sooner have our first parents fallen into sin, than God promises he is going to save people from sin and deliver them from evil and it's power. Just as sin came into the world, through one man, Adam, it is overcome and we are redeemed by one man, Jesus Christ. Psalm 129, is full of faith and hope, and is often offered for the dead that they may be released from sin and its effects. In Psalm 50, the Miserere, we have a great personal act of contrition and plea to God for forgiveness, from king David who had sinned and murdered to covered up his sin. It is important that we recognise our own sins while we find it easy to identify the sins of others. We all need to be humble before the Lord and seek his mercy and forgiveness.

This weekend at the First Holy Communion Going Forth Mass we thank our very fine team of Catechists who have given so generously of their talents and time to prepare the children for the Sacraments. Claire Platais has led the programme for quite a number of years and is having to retire from doing it due to professional and family commitments. Maggie Keeling has led the music in the church and also for the children for seven years and is having to retire for similar reasons. Our thanks to Stella Pleydell, Mary Morgan and Martin Griffin who joined the team of Catechists this years and contributed to so much and so well to a very successful course. May God bless you and protect your with his mercy and love. Fr John

**SPONSOR A CONSECRATION CROSS OR CANDLE:** Consecrated churches have twelve candles with twelve crosses around the walls of the church, to show the Church is founded on the faith of the twelve apostles. There are only four candles and crosses in our church, presumably symbolising the four evangelists. As we will celebrate the  $25^{th}$  Anniversary of the Consecration of our Church on December 7<sup>th</sup>, the eve of the feast of the Immaculate Conception and Patron of our Church, we are completing the apostolic number by putting up eight more candles and crosses. The cost of each cross is £20 and of the candle holder (similar to the existing ones) is £180 each. If parishioners would like to donate a cross or brass candle holder, they can use a red donation envelope in the Church and give them to Fr John or hand them into the Priest's House. The offerings for this purpose can also be Gift Aided by people who are paying tax.

It is essential for these sacraments that the families and children be attending Mass.
