TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY in Ordinary Time B 9th September 2018

My dear Friends,

"My soul give praise to the Lord" we say in response to Psalm 145 today. Praise and the uplifting of our mind and heart to God in prayer is the antidote to feeling downcast or depressed. It unites our spirit with the Spirit of God and enables us to see and hear his power and creative love in the world and in our own life. The play, "Children of a lesser God" powerfully expresses what it is like to live in a world of total silence, without ever having heard or hearing a sound. Equally when we have had the gift of sight, even if we should lose it, it is not possible for us to envisage what it is like for a person who has never seen light or an image.

In today's Gospel, Mark 7:31-37, we see how Jesus gives hearing and speech to a man who was deaf and dumb. We also see in the Gospels that he raised up those who were bowed down, brought the dead back to life, enabled the crippled to walk and the blind to see. All the miracles that he worked were a fulfilment of the prophecies of the Old Testament that God would come to save his people, and that he would open the eyes of the blind, the ears of the deaf to hear and the crippled who would walk and leap like the deer (Isaiah 35:4-7).

St James (2:1-5) addresses issues of discrimination and how we treat people depending on appearance and style, wealth or poverty. Christ identifies especially with the poor, and the heart of God goes out to people who are vulnerable and poor. Christ speaks of himself as being like the homeless person who "has nowhere to lay his head" (Luke 9:58). He goes out into the wilderness where he is alone with the wild beasts and is tempted and tested when he was at his weakest (Mark 1:13). We can see around us in our own time and society, people who are in much the same situation as the poor, vulnerable and broken were in the time of Christ. Just as people long ago needed the Lord to reach out and touch them in their pain and brokenness, so too people today need to be cared for, have healing and be touched by compassion and merciful love. If we Christians, as disciples of Christ, are not prepared to show his care to those in need, then who will?

Schools have re-opened after the summer holiday, and young people will soon be going to colleges or universities or starting work. We ask the Lord to be with them and their families as they go forward in yet another stage of life in the Autumn.

May the Lord help us to hear to his word and see his way at this time. Fr John

FIRST HOLY COMMUNIONS 2019: We need more parishioners to help prepare children for First Reconciliation & Holy Communion starting in September. Please contact Fr John if you can help. Our Catechists meeting will be on Wednesday 12th September at 7.30pm in the Priest's House. The first meeting for the parents of the children will be in our Church Hall on Wednesday 19th September at 8pm (NOT 12th September as stated on the application form). The first preparation session for the children will be in the Church Hall on Wednesday 26th September at 5.45pm – and subsequent Wednesdays. Application forms have been available at the back of the church since July, and must be completed and returned to the Priest's House by Monday, 10th September. It is essential that the children and their families consistently attend Sunday Mass to prepare for the Sacraments

CONFIRMATION: Bishop Alan will visit our parish and celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for young people who have been prepared on 24th February 2019. Preparation will start in September for young people in school years 9 to 12 in Secondary school. Application forms are available in church this weekend and must be completed and returned to the Priest's House by Monday 10th September. The first Meeting from the Parents and young people will be in our Parish Hall, this Tuesday, 11th September at 8pm and the young people will be presented with their books for the Confirmation Course at Masses next weekend. There will also be prayers of blessing for the young people, their parents and catechists.
