TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY in Ordinary Time B 23 September 2018

Dear Parishioners,

Jesus said, "The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of men; they will put him to death and after three days he will rise again" (Mk 9:30-37). Despite advances in civilisation, evil and violence are as widespread in the world as they were two thousand years ago. Governments as well as terrorist groups, use developments in science or psychology to intensify the sufferings and tortures they inflict on people they want to destroy. The places of persecution and mass killings are well known and the number of refugees continues to escalate. Yet, the response to their distress is often hostile and anything but Christian in some nations. There is a dangerous and populist rejection of those in need in many nations that needs to be challenged by Gospel teaching and values. So much for St Paul's exhortation and principle to "Make hospitality your special care" (Romans 12:13)! Often we too feel powerless to help relieve the sufferings of others, so that they may have justice and peace.

Our readings show the evil intentions and conspiracies of the wicked who seek to destroy the lives of good and innocent people. They say, "Let us test a person with cruelty and torture...explore his gentleness and condemn him to a shameful death" (Wisdom 2:12-20). It is wicked when individuals engage in evil activities and claim to act for God, but it appears even more immoral when evil deeds are carried out by governments, whom we expect to observe high legal and moral standards.

Jesus, the Victim, shared the sufferings and fate of all who are tortured, persecuted or murdered. He said "as long as you did it to one of these you did it to me". Though Jesus was destroyed by evil, God who is Good, did not, and never allows evil to triumph. He who raised up Jesus, who suffered and died, from the dead, will raise up and glorify all who are persecuted in the cause of right (Matt. 5:1-12).

St James (3:16-4:3) examines our heart and mind and tells us to free ourselves from self-centred, violent and wicked inclinations. If aspects of our life were put on scales: how would they weigh out? Would temptation and sin win out; or would the good and virtuous show that we share in Christ's triumph over evil and sin?

We congratulate young people who achieved success in examinations or graduated over the summer. Our best wishes go those who are leaving home and our parish at this time, and go forward in life to college, university or work. May the Lord always bless, guide and protect them. *God bless you. Fr John*
