THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

What a pickle we can create when our self-importance is tested! We have human expectations regarding our status in life and can get sensitive if someone challenges this. Today's Gospel reading guides our thoughts towards healthy Christian values.

In last week's Gospel, Jesus explained what is required of us in this world as we struggle to make ourselves ready for the enjoyment of eternal life in heaven. He set out the Christian requirement of generosity, in giving up some of our wealth, skills and time to help those who are poor and needy. Peter pressed Jesus to take into account that he and the other apostles had given up everything to follow Jesus and he thought that there should be a special reward given for this. Jesus promised no special privileges to his followers, but simply held out the prospect of eternal joy in heaven for **everyone** who followed his standards in their life.

Fast forward to this week's Gospel, where the apostles James and John request special rights and privileges in heaven. Jesus must have been very frustrated at this selfish attitude in two of his apostles and was forthright in correcting them. As followers of Jesus, we too are expected to be servants of each other, without any expectation of reward, apart, that is, from the promise of eternal life to be spent in heaven. Whatever our calling in life and whatever our circumstances, we are to focus on serving the interests of others. We are to be loving and caring in all our dealings, in whatever situation we may find ourselves. In particular, our lives should not stress our self-importance, but should just be focused on serving those who are in need. Jesus points out clearly that we need to follow his example of serving others, freely, cheerfully and without any thoughts of special rewards.

A serious challenge for us all!

INDONESIA EARTHQUAKE APPEAL: It was decided at the Parish AGM that we have a retiring collection this weekend for the Indonesia earthquake and tsunami victims, and the amount contributed should then be matched by our parish.

THE ANNUAL CTED PEACE SERVICE was held in our church last Sunday. A retiring collection for the Santa Martha Group that helps victims of modern day slavery raised **£220**. A further donation of £200 was sent from our parish.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2019: The next session for first Holy Communion children will be held in our Church hall on **Wednesday 7th November at 5.45pm**. **At the beginning of Masses on the weekend of 3/4 November the children will be presented with their Icon & Prayer of Sorrow at "The Lord have mercy"**.

CONFIRMATION: The next preparation session for the young people will be held in our Church hall on **Tuesday 6th November at 7.30pm**. **At the end of Masses on the 3/4 of November the young people will be presented with their Bibles.**

PRAYERS FOR THE DEAD: You can place the names of deceased relatives, friends and parishioners at the Altar in our Church for prayer at daily Mass during November. Please use the forms and envelopes for this purpose in the Church. There will also be a Cemetery Service & Blessing of Graves at Epping Cemetery on Sunday the 4th of November at 3pm. All are welcome to that Service.

TALKS ON OUR CATHOLIC FAITH: We have talks on the Catholic faith for adults interested in finding out about our faith, becoming Catholic or wishing to understand our faith or support the faith of family members. These are suitable for Catholic adults who have not been Confirmed or not been practising and wish to renew their faith. They are held in **The Priest's House on Wednesdays at 8pm**.

SILVER JUBILEE OF THE DEDICATION OF OUR CHURCH: Bishop Thomas celebrated the Solemn Dedication of our Church, twenty-five years ago, on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. On the **7th December** we will have a major celebration of the anniversary of that dedication with Bishop Thomas presiding at a Mass here at **7.30pm**. The full complement of 12 consecration candles and crosses, generously given by parishioners, will be in place showing our church is founded on the faith of the twelve apostles. Afterwards there will be a social celebration in the hall and everyone will have an opportunity to meet Bishop Thomas, who served at the Mass here when our church was opened in the 1954. The Dedication of a Church is a major feast in Catholic tradition, and is seen as a feast of Christ himself. **I ask parishioners to make a special effort to attend the celebration in thanksgiving to God for the life of our church.** Copies of **Dr Davnet Barker's history of our parish, "Towards a Dream"**, is available at the back of our church.
