THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B) 28 October 2018

Dear Friends,

The blind beggar shouted out to our Lord, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me" (Mk.10:46-52). Many today do not see it as necessary or important to call out or pray to God to have mercy on them. At the beginning of Mass, and most Christian worship, the first thing Christians do is to look at their sins and failings, and in a general way confess them to God and one another. We pray asking God to show us mercy and forgiveness saying, "Lord, have mercy". Eastern and Orthodox Christians express this in the "Jesus Prayer" as they say; "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, have mercy on me a sinner". Monks at the Orthodox Monastery at Tolleshunt Knights near Maldon, offer this prayer daily for many hours. It helps them and us to become more aware of our own sins before God and our dependence on his mercy for forgiveness.

The beggar by the side of the road was blind and he could not see people or what was happening around him. H did, however, recognise the presence and power of Jesus, and called out to him with faith and hope. Today, many people who have good eyesight and vision cannot see the presence of God or Christ in the world. They are blind to spiritual realities and the presence of sin in their life. They do not see a need for God in their life, and so do not call out to him for mercy or help. Jesus tells us that it is a grace to know our "poverty of spirit" and to recognise our need for God and his mercy (Matt.5:1-12).

In approaching God through Christ we must keep in mind that he sympathises with us in our human weakness and limitations (Heb.5:1-6). Our Saviour sacrificed his life, so that our sins would be forgiven and that we be reconciled to God and one another. This he did so that all people might live in love for God and each other, so that our dignity and goodness be renewed and restored.

Pride blinds us to our sins and need for God's forgiveness through Christ. If we are blind and do not see God's presence, let us look at the life and gifts he gives us, the times we are protected, the love we receive from him and others, and thank him for these. If we are blind and do not recognise the reality of sin in our life: let us see our weakness and failings, and the times we focus on ourselves and neglect to love God or others? Dare we risk asking our nearest and dearest to tell us or show us our faults? So, we need to pray: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, have mercy on me a sinner". God bless you. Fr John
