# FIRST SUNDAY IN ADVENT Year C 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2018

#### Dear Friends,

"To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul", we say in response to Psalm 24 today. As we begin the Church's New Year, we go into winter darkness and long nights. Nature goes to sleep and some people may be affected by the SAD syndrome (Seasonal Adjustment Disorder) due to lack of sunlight. At this time we Christians are called to wake from sleep and prepare for the coming of Christ, the Light of the World. His birth brings light and hope to people of goodwill at the darkest time of the year. Hence, we should lift up our soul to God to thank him for his great love for mankind.

Today's readings speak to us about the importance of changing our life to be ready for God's coming as man, in Christ. People need to "practise honesty and integrity" so that they will be ready to receive the "Lord, who is our integrity" (Jer.33:14-16). St Paul prayed that people would grow in love for one another and their hearts be confirmed in holiness, so that they will be blameless in the sight of God. He tells us to make progress in living the kind of lives that God wants us to live, so that we will be worthy of our calling as Christians in this present age" (1Thess.3:12-4:2).

Jesus speaks about the end of the world and how he will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead. This will be preceded by menacing and terrible events in nature, and between peoples and nations. He tells us that those who are watching prayerfully will see his coming as a "liberation that is near at hand", for God will be coming amongst his people again, in glory (Lk.21:25-36).

Our thanks to the organisers and everyone who worked so hard and contributed in many ways to our very successful Christmas Bazaar. Many people gave generously of their initiatives, time, talents and gifts to make an enjoyable community day for our parish. Once again, thank you so much to everyone for all you gave and did.

On Friday, at the vigil Mass of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, we celebrate the Jubilee of the Dedication or Consecration of our Church, by Bishop Thomas twenty five years ago. We welcome him back for this celebration and give thanks to God for all who have gone before us in the way of faith, and for our church and the faith which has been handed down to us. In our church, this holy place, Emmanuel, God is with us and we are at home with him. Our church is open all day every day. You can come and visit, to offer prayer or light a candle. Here we thank God for the graces and blessing he gives us and we ask him to help us as our healer and Saviour.

May the Lord give us a greater love for his Word during Advent. Fr John
