# FOURTH SUNDAY IN ADVENT C Expectant Mothers' Day 23.12.2018

### Dear Friends,

"Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, gave a loud cry and said to Mary, 'of all women you are the most blessed and blessed is the fruit of your womb" (Lk.1:39-45). The fourth Sunday of Advent is a Day of Prayer for Expectant Mothers. Mary, a young mother, rejoices in God her Saviour whom she was carrying in her womb, in the person of Jesus. She goes to visit and assist her aged cousin, Elizabeth, who is carrying her child John the Baptist in her womb. In this Visitation by our Lady to Elizabeth, the Spirit of God, by which Mary conceived Jesus, leaps as it were from Jesus in her womb, to Elizabeth and John her child, and fills them with joy.

Elizabeth asks: "Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord?" Mary responded by offering her hymn of thanksgiving and rejoicing in "The Magnificat" (Luke 1:46-55). She gave all the glory and praise to "God, the Almighty, who has done great things for me" and chose his lowly servant to be the Mother of the Saviour. Eve, the first mother in the Old Testament, was mother to sinful mankind. Mary, the first mother in the New Testament, is the mother of redeemed mankind. Just as sin and condemnation came into the world through Eve and her children, redemption and forgiveness come into the world through Mary the Mother of Jesus Christ, our Saviour. Mary recognised that God had chosen and honoured her not for any merits of her own and she praised God for all he had done for her. We can well use her words to praise and thank God for all he does for us.

Christmas, when we celebrate the birth of Christ, has a message of peace from God to people of goodwill. God places in the human hearts an expectancy and desire for peace and reconciliation at Christmas. In this season he calls for divisions to be healed, hatreds abandoned, enemies reconciled and hatred converted into love. Christmas can be difficult for families who are beset by divisions, hostilities or resentments. Families coming together at Christmas have a sense that they are intended, by God, to be united in love and to go forward together as people who are freed from past hurts. So, whilst the message of peace to people of good will was given over two thousand years ago at Christmas, it is a message which is addressed to each one of us today and is ever old and ever new.

We pray that the Christmas message of peace to people of goodwill be listened to at Christmas so that "God may impart to human hearts the blessing of his heaven". *May Christ, the Prince of Peace bless you, your families and friends. Fr John*


