Our church, like others, is closed to the public. Mass is offered daily in our parish, in private, for the needs of our people and for our country at this most testing time.

# DUE TO THE DANGERS FROM THE CORONAVIRUS WE REGRET THAT OUR CHURCH CAN NO LONGER BE OPEN DAILY UNTIL IT IS SAFE.

At this time we pray for doctors, nurses and all working in the NHS and the Emergency Services, for carers who look after the elderly and vulnerable in their home or care homes, for those who are alone and dependent on the goodness of others, for our families, for ourselves and those in need. We can reflect and pray on the Stations of the Cross and how many share in Christ's sufferings. We can light a candle at home (being careful and safe in doing so) and ask Jesus, the Light of the World to be a light and Saviour for all God's people at this time of great need, and ask Mary his Mother to intercede for us

PUBLIC MASSES with a congregation will not be celebrated in our or other Parishes this week or the near future due to the dangers from the Coronavirus. This position will continue until our bishops, following advice from the Government & NHS, declare it safe for people to congregate and meet in numbers. Priests in our parishes will offer Mass in private daily, to invoke God's protection on his people. We pray for deliverance from this virus that threatens the wellbeing of communities and nations, at home and abroad. ## FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT A

29th March 2020

#### Dear friends,

Jesus said, "I am the resurrection. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die" (Jn.11:1-45). Jesus gave this teaching on the resurrection of the dead and eternal life for all who believe in him, as he mourned the death of Lazarus, his friend. He brought the compassion of God to Martha and Mary and shared their grief at the tomb of Lazarus, their brother. St John tells us in the shortest sentence in the Bible, "Jesus wept", and the people commented, "See how much he loved him" – and yet the suffering and loss!

Jesus came as a comforter and to mourn with the sisters of Lazarus and the widow at Nain, whose only son had died (Luke 7:11-17). Of Lazarus he said, "This illness will not end in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified". When Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead God's glory was seen at work in and through him. This was his final miracle and would lead to his own sufferings and death on the cross, through which he would give even greater glory to God.

Here is the mystery of suffering, and the difficulty of understanding God's presence and action, or seeming absence or inaction in dreadful situations. We may ask, yet find it impossible to get answers as to why God allows some things to happen, like the Coronavirus pandemic, at the present time. Why did Jesus allow his friend, Lazarus, to die when he had healed others? Why did he allow Martha and Mary whom he loved, to go through mourning their brother? Why was he so distressed and wept at the tomb of Lazarus, when he knew he would raise him from the dead? In the end, we can only go forward as people of faith placing our faith and hope in Christ!

In Jesus, we see the compassion of God reach out to people in the past and present. In the Stations of the Cross, Jesus is walking with people in suffering and grief. In him, we have the hope and promise of eternal life with God, for he is the Saviour of the world and especially to those who believe in him. Ultimately, Christ our Saviour transforms sufferings and death into new and eternal life with God.

In these difficult times that we are living through, with insecurity and uncertainty, we turn to the Lord in our prayer asking him to save and protect his people. While the church is now closed, I celebrate and offer Mass in private every day for our people and constantly pray the words in the Church's Night Prayer, "Save us, Lord, while we are awake and protect us while we sleep, that we may keep with Christ and rest with him in peace". *May God bless and protect you and yours.
