Mass Book: Readings Page 149 Eucharistic Prayer Jesus doing Good Page 52

Dear friends,

“The Lord has shown his salvation to the nations” we say in response to Psalm 97 today. The reading from 2 Kings 5 shows God healing Naaman, a non-Jewish Assyrian army officer, from leprosy through Elisha, the prophet. There are so many people and factors in this narrative that it is worth reading and thinking about the roles of the different characters. The word of the Lord and his healing power was given to the officer by a servant girl who had been kidnapped by a raiding party, from Israel. She showed concern for “her master” who may have separated her from her family and home. Naaman thinks his healing has to be purchased at great expense, whereas God’s gifts are freely given and unmerited. The King of Israel thinks the request for healing is pretext to pick a quarrel. In corruptly seizing a chance to get rich quick Gehazi, Elisha’s servant, contracted the leprosy. Naaman’s servants understood the meaning of humility and showed their master that God does great things for those who are humble before him.

Ten lepers called to Jesus for healing from their leprosy (Luke 17:11-19). God’s healing power came to them and comes to us through Jesus, which is why we call him “our Saviour”. The Samaritan or non-Jewish person stands out amongst those who were healed. He shows God’s love and healing is not confined to one particular religion or group of people, “for God has no favourites” (Acts 10:34). The Samaritan recognised the great gift that God had given him and returned to offer thanks to our Lord. At every Mass we bring the needs of peoples to God in prayer and especially those in need of healing from ills of mind, body or spirit. In that context it would be good to bring the Petitions Book in our church porch to the Altar at every Mass, showing that we are bringing people and their needs, especially for healing, to the Lord in the Mass. We also give thanks, which is the meaning of the word “Eucharist” the for the words, healing and graces God gives to us through Christ our Saviour. *May God bless & heal you. Fr John*
