HALL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Under its chairman Paul Harwood, this Committee meets approximately every two months, Committee members include Arnold Verrall (Hall Bookings), Terry North (Accounts), Ted Goreham (Hall Caretaker), Dorothy Whitehouse (General Facilities) and Emma Ferns (Minute Secretary). It is the task of the Committee to manage the affairs of the Church Hall, preferably without calling on parish funds.

Hall bookings are running at a reasonable level and the Hall's finances are sound. However, about £8500 has just been spent on refurbishing the Hall kitchen, which was showing signs of wear and tear after 20 years of almost daily use. Although the Committee will fund most of this expense, some short-term 'bridging' support from the parish funds may be necessary, depending upon the Committee's cash flow. Some fund-raising events will be organised over the coming months to raise additional funds to cover the refurbishing costs.

PARISH SOCIAL COMMITTEE

This Committee meets on an *ad hoc* basis – when the need arises, Dorothy Whitehouse arranges the help required. During the year, the Committee has provided sustenance at the following events: Bereavement Service; Christmas Carol Service, Walsingham Walkers' Breakfast and Easter Vigil Reception.

Those who have lapsed from the practice of their Faith as well as the lonely and housebound have received a visit from the team.

### SOCIETY OF SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL

The parish SVP Conference made some 350 visits to people (Catholic and non-Catholic) in their own homes and in residential homes and in hospital. Through the SVP, the parish has supported financially five SVP parishes in Kerala, India, who are twinned with Epping (£500 this year). It has also given £500 to the SVP International Disaster Fund for emergency baby feeding units in Sudan and £850 to other charitable causes. We are holding £500 for the Youth Initiative in Harlow. The conference's funds come from the members and the annual parish retiring collection; however, we have not had a parish collection during the past year.

### CHURCHES TOGETHER IN EPPING & DISTRICT

### YOUTH GROUP

The new parish youth group kicked off in July 2011 with two Sunday evening meetings, the first of which was well attended. The second was less successful, but it was near to the end of term and was a miserable night, which probably put people off a little.

We have a small band of dedicated parents and parishioners, who are donating their skills and giving up their time to make this work.

We are planning to have an outing every month for the next 6 months and try to run the youth group weekly or bi-weekly if possible.

The aim of this group is to simply provide a space for young people of the parish aged 11-17 to come and socialise, make friends and be themselves in a safe environment. Adults will provide minimal input, but be there if needed.

### FINANCE & DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

The committee met on 4 occasions during the year and on each occasion the accounts were scrutinised and found to be satisfactorily presented.
