## FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT YEAR C

6th April 2025

The setting for this Sunday's **Gospel** (John 8: 1–11) is Jerusalem during the Feast of Tabernacles. Yom Kippur, the final opportunity to repent before the close of the year, has just ended. The scribes and Pharisees standing before Jesus are missing the opportunity for repentance, but the lone woman, crouched there, takes it eagerly.

Jesus is offering this chosen woman a way out of her wilderness (**First Reading** Isaiah 43: 16–21). He saves her life and then offers her the drink of new spiritual life. She leaves filled with gladness.

St Paul also received this newness of life (**Second Reading** -Philippians 3: 8–14). He, like the woman, has been possessed by Christ and desires only to continue upward toward the prize. He counts all else as rubbish. For him, knowing Christ as Lord is all that matters.

We are Pilgrims of Hope in this Jubilee year. Let's continue to move upward into Holy Week as Christ's chosen, praying that we might be agents of his forgiveness and mercy in all the situations of our lives.
